Haas Employee Buck Contest

Haas Employee Only Buck Contest

The Buck contest is between Haas employees only and will start September 14th through January 5th. Must be paid in full to Jeremy Schmidt before the 14th of September.

Entry fee is \$20 dollars per person.

You will be able to enter a buck from any kill season bow, gun, muzzleloader and so on. You will be able to enter up to 2 bucks but only the bigger of the 2 will be entered. (For example, you shoot a buck with bow that scores 20 points and then shoot one in the gun hunt season that scores 25, the higher score will be your final score entry.)

The buck will be scored by adding the number of legal points with the inside spread. (So, if you have a 6 pointer with a 14.25 inch inside spread it will score as 20.25.) If there is a tie in scores, the tallest G2 will determine the tie breaker. You will need to send a pic of your buck to me, Jeremy, showing the measurement of the spread, how many points it has, and the length of the G2.

Payout will be based on number of entries:

20 entries or less payout is to 1st place only.

21-50 entries payout will be to 3rd place.

over 50 entries payout will be to 5th place.

For over 20 entries payout will be 50% of what is in the pot: so, if there are 50 entries with a \$1000 pot 1st place will get \$500. 2nd place will get 50% of what is left in pot after 1st place payout which would be \$250. 3rd place would get 50% of what is left after that which would be \$125 and last 2 places split what is left which would be \$75 each.
